SPECIAL BLESSINGS FOR THE HOME DURING

Before the beginning of Rosh Hashanah, it is a custom for each member of the household to put some money (tzedakah) aside for a worthy cause of choice and to say this prayer:

We hereby vow to fulfill the mitzvah of tzedakah as we begin this Festival. We remember the words of Your prophet, who called us to share our bread with the hungry, to clothe the naked, and never to hide ourselves from our own kin.

May we, together with the whole House of Israel, be mindful of the needs of others, sharing with them the fruits of our labor and helping to sustain them, so that the promise may be fulfilled:

Then your light shall blaze forth like the dawn, and your wounds shall quickly heal; your righteousness shall walk before you, the glory of Adonai shall follow you.

Fountain of Life, as we begin a new year, let Your light and Your truth come forth to lead us. We look back upon the days that are past and see troubled times and days of celebration. Now we look ahead with the prayer that the new year be one of health and prosperity. When pains and troubles beset us, may we find strength to face them with courage; and when times are good for us, may we have the wisdom to be grateful for our blessings. Amen.

Special Blessings for the High Holy Days

Light the Rosh Hashanah candles and then say these two blessings:

ַבָּרוּדְ אַתָּה, יָיָ אֱלֹהֵינוּ, מֶלֶדְ הָעוֹלָם, אֲשֶׁר קדְשְׁנוּ בְּמִצְוֹתָיו, וְצְוָנוּ לְהַדְלִיק גַר שֶׁל יוֹם טוֹב.

Baruch atah, Adonai Eloheinu, Melech ha-olam, asher kid'shanu b'mitzvotav, v'tzivanu l'hadlik neir shel Yom Tov.

Blessed are You, Lord our God, Ruler of the universe, who hallows us with mitzvot, and commands us to kindle the lights of this Festival.

ַבָּרוּדְ אַתָּה, יְיָ אֶלהֵינוּ, מֶלֶדְ הָעוֹלָם, שֶׁהֶחֱינָנוּ וְקִיְּמֶנוּ וְהִגִּיעֵנוּ לַזְּמַן הַזֶּה.

Baruch atah, Adonai Eloheinu, Melech ha-olam, shehechiyanu v'kiy'manu v'higi-anu laz'man hazeh.

We praise You, Lord our God, Ruler of the universe, for giving us life, sustaining us, and enabling us to reach this season.

ROSH HASHANAH AND YOM KIPPUR

Lift up a cup of wine or grape juice and say:

בָּרוּדְ אַתָּה, יְיָ אֶלהֵינוּ, מֱלֶדְ הָעוֹלָם, בּוֹרֵא פְּרִי הַגְּפֶׁן.

Baruch atah, Adonai Eloheinu, Melech ha-olam, borei p'ri hagafen.

Blessed are You, Lord our God, Ruler of the universe, Creator of the fruit of the vine,

Take a slice of challah and say:

(A round challah is traditional on Rosh Hashanah)

ַבָּרוּדְ אַתָּה, יְיָ אֶלהֵינוּ, מֱלֶדְ הָעוֹלָם, הַמּוֹצִיא לֶחֶם מִן הָאָרֶץ.

Baruch atah, Adonai Eloheinu, Melech ha-olam, hamotzi lechem min ha-aretz.

Blessed are You, Lord our God, Ruler of the universe, who brings forth bread from the earth.

Dip a slice of apple in honey and say these blessings for a sweet New Year:

בַּרוּדְ אַתַּה, יָיַ אֵלהֵינוּ, מֱלֶדְ הַעוּלָם, בּוֹרָא פָּרִי הַעֵּץ.

Baruch atah, Adonai Eloheinu, Melech ha-olam, borei p'ri ha-eitz.

Blessed are You, Lord our God, Ruler of the universe, Creator of the fruit of the tree.

יָהִי רָצוֹן מִלְפָנֵיך, יִיָ אֱלֹהֵינוּ, שֵׁתְּחַדֵּשׁ עַלֵינוּ שָׁנָה טוֹבָה וּמִתוּקָה.

Y'hi ratzon mil'fanecha, Adonai Eloheinu, shet'chadeish aleinu shanah tovah um'tukah.

May it be Your will, Lord our God, that this be a good and sweet year for us.

Light the Yom Kippur candles and then say:

בָּרוּדְ אַתָּה יְיָ אֱלֹהֵינוּ מֱלֶדְ הָעוֹלָם, אֲשֶׁר קִדְּשֵׁנוּ בְּמִצְוֹתָיו, וְצִוָּנוּ לְהַדְלִיק גֵר שֶׁל שַׁבָּת וְשֶׁל יוֹם הַכִּפּוּרִם.

Baruch atah, Adonai Eloheinu, Melech ha-olam, asher kid'shanu b'mitzvotav, v'tizvanu l'hadlik neir shel Shabbat v'shel Yom HaKipurim.

Blessed are You, Lord our God, Ruler of the Universe, who hallows us with mitzvot, and commands us to kindle the lights of Shabbat and of the Day of Atonement.

TICKET POLICY

All tickets will be sent to your email electronically this year. Each ticket will work for one person only. High Holy Days tickets are provided to all members in good standing. Members who are not in good standing will be notified and asked to make arrangements to improve their status. If they do so, they will be provided tickets. There are other instances when tickets are provided for attendance:

- Out-of-town, unaffiliated adult children of congregants are offered tickets upon request, free of charge.
- Congregants may request tickets for out-of-town, unaffiliated family members and guests to accompany them. A donation is requested, with a minimum donation of \$100 per guest.
- In town, unaffiliated, adult children 35+ are asked for a \$100 donation per ticket.
- Free High Holy Days tickets are provided upon request to any young adult, 34 and under.
- Tickets are provided free of charge to prospective members for one year only.
