

Rabbi Lewis H. Kamrass, Senior Rabbi

Rabbi Kamrass is the Senior Rabbi of Isaac M. Wise Temple of Cincinnati, Ohio, where he has spent his entire rabbinate of nearly

forty years. Rabbi Kamrass is a Phi Beta Kappa, summa cum laude graduate of the University of Georgia in Sociology and Psychology, with a Master of Hebrew Letters and Rabbinic Ordination from Hebrew Union College-Jewish Institute of Religion (HUC-JIR), as well as recipient of an honorary Doctor of Divinity degree. He served for 25 years as an Instructor in the Theology Department of Xavier University and as adjunct faculty at HUC-JIR.* In the national Reform movement, Rabbi Kamrass currently serves as Immediate Past President of the Central Conference of American Rabbis, the 2200-member international body of Reform Rabbis, and also serves on its Board. He has served as a Board Member of the HUC-JIR* and the Union for Reform Judaism. He is married to Renee Kamrass and together they are the proud parents of three children and their spouses, and proud grandparents to their seven grandchildren, all members of Wise Temple.



Rabbi Neil P.G. Hirsch, Senior Rabbi Successor

In July 2024, Rabbi Hirsch joined Isaac M. Wise Temple as our Senior Rabbi Successor.

Prior to joining Wise Temple, Rabbi Hirsch served as Senior Rabbi of Hevreh of Southern Berkshire in Western Massachusetts from 2015-2024 and Associate Rabbi of Temple Shalom in Newton, Massachusetts from 2010-2015. Rabbi Hirsch is a graduate of Tufts University in Boston, Massachusetts, where he studied Art History and Classics. He received a Masters of Hebrew Literature and Rabbinic Ordination from HUC-JIR* and is currently completing a doctorate in Halakhah (Jewish Law) and Jewish Ethics, researching the ethics of care, accountability, and t'shuvah (repentance). Rabbi Hirsch is married to Rabbi Liz Hirsch, who serves as the CEO of Women of Reform Judaism and host of the podcast "Just For This." They have two children.



Rabbi Zachary S. Goodman, Associate Rabbi

Rabbi Goodman was born and raised in Dallas, Texas and attended the University of Texas at Austin before he was ordained on the

Cincinnati campus of HUC-JIR.* Following his ordination in 2019, Rabbi Goodman served as the Assistant Rabbi at Holy Blossom Temple in Toronto before joining the Wise Temple family in the summer of 2022. Rabbi Goodman is passionate about Israel education, youth and teen engagement, young professional programming, and learning in all its many forms. In the weeks preceding the High Holy Days, we engage in profound introspection, reflecting upon the events of the past year to acknowledge personal successes and areas for growth in anticipation of the year ahead. Throughout this two-week course, participants will delve into Mussar, a rich Jewish tradition focused on refining character traits through study, contemplation, and practical application. Together, we will explore the principles and practices of Mussar, aiming to cultivate the virtues of a true mensch.

Understanding Repentance, Apologies, and Forgiveness

Rabbi Neil Hirsch

October 1, 8, 15

During the High Holy Days we focus our prayers and energy on *t'shuvah*, the process of repentance, enabling us to enter into a new year for goodness and blessing. Many use this time to repair relationships that have been fractured. Given its centrality to Yom Kippur, *t'shuvah* though is often discussed though not always understood. How we understand the role of offering apologies for wrongs committed and how we understand what forgiveness is colors how we experience *t'shuvah*. In this three part series with Rabbi Hirsch, explore the look, sound, and intent behind *t'shuvah*, specifically studying how repentance works. We will use Jewish texts to better understand how we put forward our penitent hearts, and how we are to respond when someone offers us their own.

Sacred Dimensions: What is "Holiness"?

The Jewish tradition is teeming with holy places, holy days, holy items, and even holy people. But what does it truly mean for something to be deemed "holy" within Jewish life? This course invites us to explore the spiritual significance of both time and space within Judaism, uncovering the holiness inherent in both. From the sacred rhythms of the Jewish calendar and holy days to the holy spaces of ancient temples and contemporary homes, we will investigate the rituals, symbols, and practices that imbue times and spaces with sanctity. Join us as we uncover the sacredness that permeates every moment and every corner of the Jewish experience.

God Concepts in the Bible and Rabbinic Literature: A Sampling to Stimulate Our Personal Belief

Contrary to what most people think, our classical literature of Bible, Talmud and other rabbinic literature are far from monolithic in theology or emphasis on qualities of God. These great sources reveal wide-ranging ideas of God, with many parallel tracks or viewpoints, none competing with one another, but each to challenge and to stimulate our own theology and personal ideas of God. Rabbi Kamrass will introduce us to some God concepts we might expect, as well as many others that would be unexpected and even surprising and expansive in their approach from so many centuries ago. Examining these characteristics of God revealed in our literature is a sampling to whet our own spiritual appetite, and to challenge and enlarge our own perspectives.
